

Organisational matters II

Language requirements

Most seminars at EHD are taught in German. In order to successfully undertake studies and enjoy your stay, you will need German skills of at least B1 level. The language certificate can be issued by your home university, the local Goethe-Institut or a private language school. It must contain a letterhead and a signature. This rule does not apply to native speakers. If German is not your native language, you can attend a German course. EHD will cover the cost.

Semester ticket

You will receive a semester ticket for the period of your stay (Fee: about 200 EUR) With this ticket, you can use all local trains, suburban trains, underground trains, trams and buses within the area covered by the RheinMainVerkehrs-verbund (RMV) - southern and central Hesse, as well as a few locations further afield - during your entire stay.

Classes: early Oct. – late Jan.
Summer semester: 1 Apr. – 30 Sept.
Classes: mid-Apr. – mid-Jul.

Exchange studies at EHD

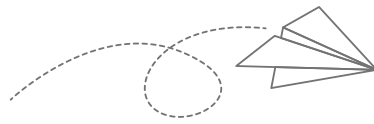
If you are registered at one of our partner universities, you can come to EHD as an exchange student for 1-2 semesters to study, undertake research or complete a (supervised) traineeship.

You have access to the entire range of modules on the bachelor's and master's programmes named above. Our website provides information about course content and credits (relevant for drafting a learning agreement)

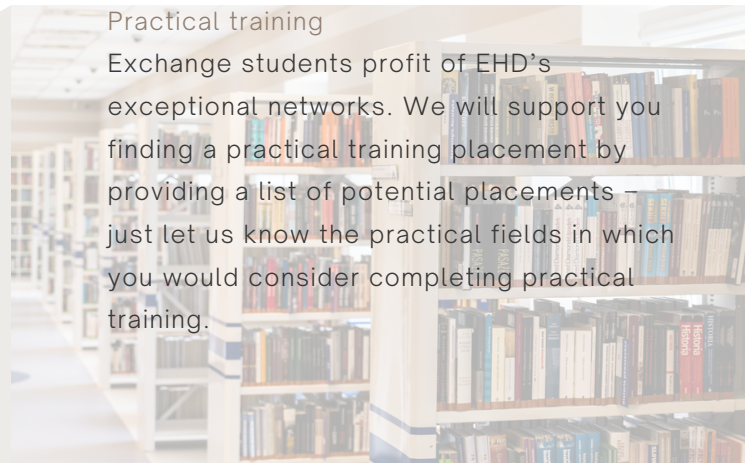

Anyone completing an internship in the social-work-field can attend an associated supervision, as well as a study group. The aim is to help students transferring theory into practice. Application

Exchange students must be nominated for exchange studies at EHD by their home university – contact your home university's International Office for further details. Once you have been nominated we will send you further information and forms to complete.

Accommodation

The International Office has access to a limited quota of rooms in the student hall of residence. Monthly rental costs for a room are currently 225 EUR (including internet, electricity etc.). Each bathroom is shared by two students, and a shared kitchen is also available on each floor. Duvets and pillows are provided by EHD.
